Archdale Improvements in Progress

Some good news in the 4th quarter - two of the major concerns from our community are finally being resolved. Drainage system improvements are funded and planning is underway. The outdated & weather worn sign for Stirling Forest is being replaced. How much will this cost us, you ask??? NOTHING - it's all paid for!!!

Most are sure to have noted the considerable flood issues throughout our neighborhood over the years. Dorchester County Council Storm Water Management Committee publicly approved \$255,000 to fix the flooding issues on Botany Bay Ct. and drainage at the Lewisfield and Scottswood intersection, thanks to the support of Councilman George Bailey. County Council has funded the project with money from the Storm Water Fund and they are accepting bids for the work. more detailed information jump to President's Corner on the back page. As a side note, property owners

received a 30% reduction in the Storm Water Management Fee on our 2012 Dorchester County property tax bills.

The Stirling Forest sign is being replaced after being severely damaged in an unfortunate Car vs. Sign accident that occurred on October 1st. The driver's insurance carrier has accepted the replacement estimate and funds are already in hand. Johnston Signs is currently working on the project.

10 Tips for Winterizing your Home

- Inspect/Clean-up Roof, Gutters & Downspouts
- Check Exterior Doors & Windows: weather-stripping!!!
- 3. Test/Replace Smoke & Carbon Monoxide Detectors
- Prevent Plumbing Freezes: A/C pipes, garden hoses, insulate crawlspace pipes
- 5. Get Fireplace Ready: Sweep, inspect, get firewood or gas
- Inspect the Furnace: contact a professional ... it's worth it!
- 7. Landscaping & Outdoor Surfaces: plant bulbs, trim trees, bring potted plants in, consult a gardener before pruning
- Check Foundation: seal up entry points, cracks, crawl spaces
- Service Lawn Equipment: drain gas, replace rakes/shovels
- 10. Winter Emergency Kit: candles, blankets, weather radio

While Shopping ...

- Park in well-lit areas at night and take a friend.
- Store packages out of sight in your vehicle.
- Walk to car with keys in hand, they can be used •

as a weapon if needed.

- Carry minimal cash and only necessary ID & credit cards.

Dorchester County Council has approved our request for \$255,000 to improve storm water drainage in our community, allocated as follows:

\$130,000

Rebuild the Botany Bay Court road and drainage system to improve drainage and eliminate flooding. This problem has been the source of numerous complaints over a prolonged period of time. The road was poorly designed and constructed such that there is very little slope and no means to provide for adequate drainage of the road. This is compounded by settlement of the curbs and storm-water boxes. Completion of this project will restore proper drainage to this road and eliminate current flooding issues.

\$125 000

Modify drainage and road at Lewisfield Dr. and Scottswood intersection to eliminate flooding. This is essentially the same problem and solution as stated in the above project for Botany Bay Court. This would have not been possible without the support of our County Councilman, George Bailey, for which we are all grateful!
